SINS OF OMISSION



n the General Confession in the Morning and Evening Prayer, we are directed to beg forgiveness because "we have left undone those things we ought to have done." We tend to think of sin as doing something terrible, something we should not do. But this sentence



in the confession makes it clear that not doing something we should do is equally grievous. We Christians are roundly criticized for being negative. We always tell people you can't do this or can't do that. Eight of the Ten Commandments tell us not to do something. To approach our faith this way also makes it very easy for us to get into a comfortable, self-righteous rut. We convince ourselves we are good Christians because we never do any of that nasty stuff. But remember the story of the man who had an unclean spirit driven out of him. (Matt. 12:43) The spirit returned to the man and found him clean, swept, and put in order, but empty. The man had nothing to fill the space left by the evil. So the spirit found seven of his friends who were more evil than he and they all moved into the man. Not to fill the space left by repented evil is a great sin of omission. What then should we do?

The Bible is filled with things we ought to be doing. This is covered in the Summary of the Law we read in the Sunday service. "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." That one sentence gives us more than we could do for all the rest of our lives. Let's start with the simple things. It has been a long time since I have been hungry, cold, or



even sick. I am blessed! God is always telling us to take care of those folks who are. Could you donate to the food bank? How about cleaning your closet and taking the extra coats and blankets to Goodwill? You can visit those who are sick, give them a call, or send a card. "Of course," you say, "I will take care of that first thing in the morning."

Our biggest lie is, "I will do that tomorrow." That takes care of it. We didn't say we were not going to do it. We promised ourselves and others that we would do it, but not now. There may not be a tomorrow. Some sick friend may die tonight. Someone is starving under a bridge tonight. Even if there is a tomorrow, tomorrow races by at a fantastic speed and can never be recovered.

When we talk ourselves out of channeling God's love, that is a sin of omission. If we can help and do not, that is a sin of omission. Can you ease someone's burden? Can you reduce the loneliness? Can you send some money or spare the time? When you do, you are reflecting the love Christ has shown you. Love is a verb.


All morning services begin at 10:00 AM and evening services at 6:30 PM


